



## Lunch with Luther: Six Themes in Lutheran Theology

The German theologian and reformer Martin Luther lived from 1483 to 1546. Luther's struggles for assurance of God's mercy through monastic discipline and the careful study of the Scriptures led finally to his discovery of the Biblical promise of justification by faith in Christ alone. Nearly five hundred years after his death, Luther's insights into the relationship between God and man still instruct, provoke, inspire, and comfort.
